







Forests In Lebanon Species and Location

- ➤ Pine Forests: Western slopes of Mount Lebanon
- ➤ Cedars : Patches on Western slopes of mount Lebanon
- Fir: Mainly North Lebanon With the cedars
- ➤ Juniper: Patches on Eastern Slopes of the Mountain Chain Hermel
- >Evergreen cypress: Patches in Akkar, Ayto Ehden




